Old members: Larry walker talked about his latest flights.

Tom said he had an emergency landing at Norfolk airport. Since it's a private one, they didn't like him landing there.

Officer's reports:

1. Jim discussed the Treasurer's report.
2. No Safety officer volunteer yet.
3. No Secretary's report. Not present.
4. Larry mentioned this meeting had a lot of participants: About 22. Larry took some pictures.
5. Membership Director not present.

Old business:

1. Tom described the progress on the new hangar. He doesn't want a work party but

- Larry will coordinate the ceremony, and will try to connect the pilot’s radio to a sound system.
- The radio frequency should be 122.9.

- All visitors and pilots need to sign a liability waver form.
- No advertising for rides, but Larry have the liability insurance to give rides to “Young Eagles” under the EAA program.
- An e-mail to the neighboring ultralight clubs needs to be send ahead of time. Jim is looking for the list of clubs, Len do you have a contact list?
- Tom offered his expertise to set a static display of several aircraft. The only concern raised is removing valuables from the planes before visitors are coming.

8. Larry demonstrated the Ethanol /Fuel test. Audience loved it. Thank you Larry.
9. Jim Birnbaum hosted the barbeque. Thank you Jim.
