I found this deliciousness at Jim Thrush's barbecue restaurant in Burlington, WV. I think of it as an airport restaurant because it's next to Jim's private grass airfield where he keeps an immaculate Taylorcraft. Peter Richter and I were touring West Virginia airfields and dropped in for a lunch I haven't forgotten.



Alas, he's open only seasonally, and this year closed on August 11<sup>th</sup> because of COVID. But don't let that stop you come next spring. He'll be open and you'll be hungry. Call ahead. Jim's phone is 304-289-3693.

OK, but where is it, exactly? At Lucy Ooi's urging, I created a map on the club website of airfields that have restaurants. The \$100 hamburger is alive and well, it seems.



To see it:

**Step 1:** Go to the Flying Club 1 website, FlyingClub1.org.

Step 2: Click Airfields with restaurants on the sidebar.



**Step 3:** Click on an airport. That brings up a panel like this:



Step 4: If you click further, on See in Satellite view in iFlight Planner, you'll get the satellite view. But iFlightPlanner lets you switch between Map, Satellite, Sectional, and Terminal Area Chart views, via a dropdown in the top right corner like this



The screen shot above shows nine restaurants. But the actual map shows ten more, especially on the Eastern Shore and in Tidewater. With all of these places, you should call before you go, as their hours may have changed, especially during COVID.

"Well," you may say, "this is all fine for Lucy. She flies an Aeronca Champ. She goes a lot faster than I do. And she doesn't get bounced around as much in the lunchtime thermals as I do.

Maybe *she* wants to be in Cumberland at noon looking at a 90-minute mid-day return flight over the mountains. But *I* sure don't."

Not to worry. There will always be cloudy low-wind days like the day that took me to Jim Thrush's place. If range is an issue for you, settle for flying to the Robin's Nest Café at Shannon. Or to the Copper Kettle at Sky Bryce. Buy gas at Shannon or Luray.



## A Project: Wheels for the Grill

Are you looking for a small project? How about taking on this one for the club?

**Problem.** Every meeting, we haul our grill from Jim Heidish's hangar up to the cedar grove. This is harder to do than it should be because the wheels are small and the terrain rough.

**Solution:** Put big wheels on the grill. Like this:



#### Constraints.

- 1. You mustn't raise the grill itself higher, so you can't just replace the wheels.
- 2. Wheel diameter. The wheels can be up to 27½" in diameter. Maybe like this or this.
- 4. **Axles.** The axles must attach to the grille's base frame. The frame at that point consists of a rectangular steel tube 3/4" x 21/4" with very thin walls. The walls are too thin and the tubes too squeezable to let you just stick a bolt through the tube to serve as an axle. You probably need reinforcing plates with several bolts to spread out the load.
- 5. **No common axle.** You cannot mount both wheels on one axle rod that extends from one leg to the other. The space between the legs must remain open so that you can get the gas bottle in and out.

Interested? Let me know. Come up with a design and a budget, and we'll ask for membership approval at the next meeting. president@flyingclub1.org.
