### The Privileged View

We lost our hangar. Tanya Woodward, the Airport Director at KCJR has asked us to vacate our hangar by the end of September. Here's the story.

- 1. The hangar lease is held by Club member Rick Van Doren, who sold his own airplane in the spring of 2023.
- 2. As a member of the Club, he was a co-owner of the Breese. But KCJR doesn't see it that way. In their opinion, only parties on the FAA registration are co-owners. Our registration is solely in the name of Flying Club 1, Inc.
- 3. Therefore, in their opinion, Rick has actually been subleasing the hangar to us for the past 16 months.
- 4. Under the terms of his lease, a sublease can last for only one year. At that point, if the leaseholder has not gotten an airplane of their own, the airport director can **at her discretion** give the lease to the subleasing party. That would be us. She declines to do so. She didn't say why.

**Appeals for volunteers bring few results.** Last month, I appealed to the members asking for volunteers for the key jobs of fundraising chief, maintenance chief, flight ops chief, and CFI chief. Only the last job got filled (thank you both **Shawn Lillemo** and **Sean Roe**). An appeal to the former members asking for fundraising help produced the offer of a donation (thank you, **Tom Simmons**) but no advice on fundraising.

Where our Airplane Project Stands. Eightneed months ago, we set out to acquire an airplane with which to train pilots inexpensively. Until the crash of the Breese we were almost there. At this point, things look bleak. We have no airplane, no hangar, not enough volunteers, and \$13,000 in debt. On the asset side, we have all the necessary administrative stuff in place – corporate structure, bylaws, 501(c)7 tax status, waivers, operating rules, Flight Circle setup, and so on.

And then another of those miracles happened of the kind that has kept this project going <u>time and again</u> – we got an offer of an airplane – or at least an airplane kit...

**LCDR Darryl "Short Round" Abriam** offers to give us a Challenger II. Out of the blue, I got an email from a Navy pilot at Dahlgren. He's Darryl Abriam, but goes by his flying handle "Short Round". Here's his story:

- I love giving back to the aviation community! I got my PPL for free in high school because I went to an Aviation Academy Magnet school. I have greatly appreciated being given that wonderful opportunity, that I have been paying it forward since.
- I have given multiple lessons for free both in the ground and in the air to kids and other community members (middle school & high school STEM events, in-flight reenlistments/promotion ceremonies, ROTC, Sea Cadets, life guards, YMCA, flight festivals, EAA young eagles).
- I currently have a C-172 in Florida that I use to grant one student a year flight training for the PPL for free.
- I have spent majority of my military career in FL, but recently moved to Dalhgren VA. My current military [3-year] tour is a non-flying tour, so I have no flying for work for the next few years. I didn't want to bring my C-172 to VA because I want to keep it in FL to continue the flight scholarship I have going on over there. Therefore I needed a new plane to fly while I am in VA to keep scratching the itch and to continue introducing other people into the joys of flying.
- I wanted another C-172, but since C-172 prices have skyrocketed ever since COVID, I could not afford another one. Instead, I opted to buy a Challenger II kit last year. I was hoping to be done with it in a few months and get back to flying. However, the build has been going was slower than expected, and it is now been over a year and I am still not done. Since I was itching to fly, and although a C-172 was out of budget, I still had some space in the budget to buy a C-150 instead.
- Now that I have a plane to fly up here [the 150], the need for me to own the Challenger and fly it all the time is no longer necessary. Which is why I am ok with the club using it. Especially since it will be once again fulfilling my desire to pay it forward and to get more people into aviation.

Short Round is offering to give the plane to the Club if we can help him finish it. **Sean Roe** has built and now flies a Challenger II and offers his expertise. **Shawn Lillemo** is willing to spend serious hours on the project. Other club members are willing to help build a plane. Sean guesses that the project will take another 200 labor hours to complete.

Beyond labor, we'll need a place to build it. The project has already outgrown Short Round's one-car garage on base at Dahlgren. Finding that build space – and paying for it – are tasks still to be sorted out. Plus, cold weather is coming.

Shawn Lillemo has emerged as the de facto project lead. If you're interested in helping out, please get in touch with him.

The Board votes to sit tight. At its last meeting, the Club's Board of Directors decided to not kill the airplane project but to suspend it until next spring. We'll hang onto the Breese's engine (as a possible maintenance spare) and other bits that might be useful on the Challenger build. We'll see if we can actually get it built and if we can find a hangar and the necessary volunteers to run a flying program. We'll re-assess the question next April or May.



Here's the data you need:

- It's 8:44am on September 6, 2023.
- I am headed west, 8 miles west of Abingdon on the track shown here.
- I am in Class G airspace in an area where Class E begins at 700'.
- Visibility is 4 miles.
- My altimeter says I'm at 2,766' MSL.
- The ceiling is at 2,800' MSL. (I floated up to cloudbase to measure that, then came down again.)
- The valleys here are about 1,900', the hilltops are 2,100'.



#### Status of the Breese

- **Jackie George** suggested that we hold off selling the engine until we see if we get an airplane that has the same engine (a Rotax 582). If so, we should keep the old engine as a spare. Likewise with some other accessories such as the radio, helmet, intercom, and EIS.

#### Old Business – Where Does the Club Go from Here?

Steve reported that at its <u>meeting on August 3<sup>rd</sup></u>, the Club's Board of Directors looked at the choice between getting another airplane vs. reverting to being just a social club. The Board decided that the choice hinges on finding volunteers who will head up the key jobs:

• Fundraising Chief. Responsible for raising the money to buy the plane.

- *Maintenance Chief.* Responsible for seeing that the airplane is maintained.
- *Flight Operations Chief.* Responsible for the pilots. Guide newbies into the program and sort out any issues that come up among the pilots.
- CFI Chief. Responsible for recruiting a cadre of CFIs. Responsible for our training syllabus.

#### To that end:

- *Fundraising*. There were several ideas of whom to approach, but no one volunteered to do the work.
  - **Bob Chapman** said he would ask EAA 186 if they would accept donations of an airplane on our behalf since they are a tax-deductible charity. They would then give us the plane. [EAA 186 subsequently agreed to this.]
  - **Kurt Mohr** said he had heard of possible airplanes at Bear River and at Keymar. He will inquire. [He subsequently did, but these did not pan out.]
- Maintenance. Shawn Lillemo, Bryan Chaisone, Arvind Singh, Tee Wubie, and Bob Chapman all volunteered to help out on maintenance.
- Flight Operations. No discussion. No volunteers.
- *CFI Chief.* Both **Sean Roe** and **Shawn Lillemo** volunteered for this job. Both plan to become CFIs themselves.

#### Old Business – Newsletter Editor

• **Steve Beste** volunteered to be the newletter editor for the time being.
